#### Content

This course provides a general overview of methodology for presenting and documenting artistic research in general, and practice-based design research in the field of textiles and fashion in particular. Furthermore, the course provides in-depth instruction in oral and written presentations, with a particular focus on visual presentation techniques such as photography and filmmaking.

### **Learning Outcomes**

To achieve a passing grade, the doctoral student shall:

- 1. Demonstrate intimate knowledge of general forms of presentation and documentation of artistic research.
- 2. Demonstrate wide-ranging knowledge and a systematic understanding of the presentation and documentation of practice-based design research, and advanced and current specialist knowledge of the textile field within the specialisation chosen (Textile Design, Fashion Design, Textile Interaction Design).
- 3. Demonstrate the ability to present and discuss research and research findings authoritatively in speech and writing with a particular focus on the artistic research field.
- 4. Demonstrate the ability to critically view and master both the contents of and rhetorical form of photographic research images.
- 5. Demonstrate the ability to develop methods for presenting and documenting research with scholarly precision critically, autonomously and creatively, and review and evaluate such work in a critical manner.

#### Forms of Teaching

The course consists of seminars and studio work performed with supervision (photography, filmmaking, etc.).

The language of instruction is English.

### **Forms of Examination**

The course is examined in relation to the intended learning outcomes through the following components: Seminars (Outcomes 1, 2, and 5), 2 higher education credits. Grading scale: Pass/Fail.

Presentation and documentation of research work (Outcomes 2, 3, and 4), 3 higher education credits. Grading scale: Pass/Fail.

Student rights and obligations at examination are in accordance with guidelines and rules for the University of Borås.
